As per our Right-To-Know packet, for any "Non-Routine" task that we perform on site a site specific plan with necessary training is required. It might be as basic as how to install lead-lined rock or as complicated as fall protection when working on the edge of a building.

If you have any questions regarding whether a site specific plan is necessary, speak to your foreman, Supt. or Sturg.

Inspect & sign the tag on your fire extinguishers.

Call the warehouse for "**RED TAGS**," any safety signage & inspection sheets for lifts & scaffold.
